Service Area Description

Delivery of technical advice to fulfil the Council's Development Management responsibility for responding to planning enquiries and planning applications in Westmorland and Furness Council on behalf of the Lead Local Flood Authority and Coastal Protection Authority.

Ensuring co-operation and effective collaboration between the Flood and Coastal Risk Management Team, Local Planning Authorities and other Risk Management Authorities, partnership organisations, and other stakeholders within the North West Regional Flood and Coastal Committee area.

Purpose of this Post

The Development Management Officer - Flood is responsible for preparing formal responses to planning enquiries and applications and to ensure provision of an effective and appropriate standard of service, reflecting the relevant policies, technical principles, guidance and regulations/legislations relative to the area of responsibility.

To provide technical advice in accordance with the Flood and Water Management Act 2010 and the relevant legislation and coordinate the Council response to applications.

Key Job Specific Accountabilities

1. To carry out activities relating to evaluating and assessing planning applications and planning enquires which impact on the Council's flood and coastal risk, provide formal response on behalf of the Lead Local Flood Authority and negotiate appropriate mitigating measures, such as financial contributions or infrastructure improvements, as part of the planning process.
2. To review Sustainable Drainage Verification Reports and their suitability for mitigating the impacts of development and to monitor the implementation of Drainage Plans to ensure the objectives are realised and planning impacts mitigated.
3. To coordinate consultations and undertake activities associated with negotiating contributions and improvements in respect of areas of responsibility resulting in Section 106. To assist with the drafting and subsequent management of Section 106 Agreements which include clauses relating to Flood Resilience matters ensuring that contributions are received and spent and implemented within the stipulated timeframes.
4. Provide advice to colleagues, other officers and external parties on the interpretation and application of policies, technical principles and regulations/legislations in respect of the areas of responsibility.

5. Carry out other tasks commensurate with the grade as may be required, including responding to emergency situations relating to flooding and drainage issues.
