They were a place for rest and refreshments, to read books and newspapers, play billiards or to write letters home using writing paper and envelopes provided by the YMCA.</p> <p>The Keswick Hut, according to the caption accompanying the photograph (reference YMCA/K/8/1/79) was in the Calais area. The Keswick Hut was provided and supported by the Keswick branch of the YMCA but would have been for all the use of any service men in the area where it was located. From the book 'War Work of Auxiliary Hospitals and Voluntary Aid Detachments in Cumberland, Westmorland and parts of North Lancashire' it is understood to be 28 men originally converted to 26 beds for officers. In the rest of 1917 33 officers were treated, then 112 in 1918 and 25 in 1919 before closure on 30 Apr 1919 with a closing balance of funds of £346/18/8. The figure of 67 men treated before conversion is correct. The house was built by the Greenall (Brewing) family and sold to Lord & Lady Rochdale around the turn of the 19th/20th century, they continued to own it through the generations until 2013. In 2013 it was converted to luxury Self Catering Holiday Accommodation. Beatrix Potter spent 7 summers there.</i>
